General Scholarships

- **Warren Education Association (WEA)**-The WEA will award a \$1,000 scholarship to a graduating senior from Warren Mott High School. Students who have an immediate family member in a labor union and will be attending a public institution of higher education in the fall. To be considered, applicants must have at least a 3.0 GPA and an ACT score of 23. Applications are available in the counseling center and must be postmarked by **April 30, 2013**.
- **Winning Futures**-Juniors and Seniors who have successfully completed the Winning Futures Mentoring Program (with a 70% or higher) are eligible to apply for the Winning Futures Scholarship. Scholarships are based on scholarship application scores and interview scores. Academic history (GPA) is not a factor. Scholarship applications are due **Thursday, March 14 by 2:00 p.m.** Applications are available in the counseling center.
- **Realtors Association**-The Realtors Association Scholarship Fund provides financial assistance for high school seniors attending a Michigan college or university. For more information about this scholarship opportunity visit www.gmaronline.com/scholarship-app/. Applications are available online and in the counseling center. Apply by **Monday, March 18, 2013**.
- **Student Insights**-The 2013 Student-View Scholarship Program is offering \$10,500 worth of scholarships to high school seniors who plan to attend a four-year college, community college/junior college, or career school. Simply log onto

www.student-view.com and complete a 15-20 minute survey about colleges in your area. The scholarship will be awarded via random drawing of all completed applications. The scholarship deadline is **April 21, 2013**.

- **Michigan Retailers Association (MRA)**- MRA has launched its scholarship competition for the 2013-2014 school year. While the exact number of scholarships has not yet been set, we expect to award at least 30 \$1,000 scholarships. The awards are **not** based on financial need. To be eligible, the student his/her parent must be employed at a business that is a member of MRA. Students are encouraged to apply at www.retailers.com, under the Education & Events tab. Applications must be requested by **March 15** and submitted by **April 1, 2013**.
